Dear Friends,

Earlier this summer Franklin Graham called for a "Special Day of Prayer for the President", so that prayers would be said, that God would protect, strengthen, embolden and direct President Trump. Franklin stated: "Our nation is at a



crossroads at a dangerous precipice. The only one who can fix our nation's problems is God Himself, and we pray that God will bless our President and our nation for His glory."

I believe it is our duty to pray for our President and all of our leaders, not just the President. As Presbyterians it is expected that we will do just that! In our prayers resources are prayers like this one. "Mighty God, Sovereign over the nations, direct those who administer and judge our laws; the President of the United States and other in authority among us...that guided by your wisdom, they may lead us in the way of righteousness; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen" I try to use a prayer like this one regularly in worship, though I have noticed of late, I have been a bit negligent in that practice. I confess as our politics as a nation have become more and more divisive I have less frequently brought our political leaders before God in our prayers. This is the opposite of what I know is needed. I will do better in the future.

Throughout my ministry I have sought to be an equal opportunity prayer, lifting up both those for whom I voted and for those whom I did not vote. In my nearly forty years of pastoral service each President has in his own way, needed much help with the way of righteousness, wisdom and justice and so I prayed for those correctives regularly. I pray this way because I believe those correctives are vital for those who have been given power over the lives of others. We need strong genuine Christian influence in politics. "What does the Lord require of you but to do justice, love kindness and walk humbly with your God?" (Micah 6:8) This is a very high standard for leadership and apart from divine guidance is unattainable. So we lift up our leaders beseeching God to direct their words and actions.

Genuine Christian influence lifts up the righteousness, wisdom and justice of God! Certainly we should pray for the President and not just one Sunday, but daily. Our President needs as much prayer as he can get. And, we should remember to pray for God's sense of righteousness, wisdom, and justice be poured out upon the President, not for God to "bless the President" (meaning carry out his or his party's agenda), but rather that God's ways will guide and direct all that the President does to lead our nation and the world.

SHEPHERDS

On the Deacons agenda every month is the item 'Shepherds'. I asked the question last month, "Who is your Shepherd" to which Pastor Tim promptly replied, "The Lord is my Shepherd". Wouldn't it be wonderful if we all answered so quickly? But that was not the answer I was seeking..."Who is your Church Shepard?", Did you know you even had one? I checked the Bible Concordance when I got home and there were 31 references to the word *Shepherd or Shepherding* in the Bible. And even more if you reference the word *sheep*. The favorite and one we all know is Psalm 23 "The Lord is my Shepherd...." My favorite from the New Testament is from John, Chapter 21 where Jesus asks Simon Peter three times "Do you love me?" And when Simon Peter answers "Yes, Lord you know that I love you" to all the questions, Jesus says, "1)Feed my lambs, 2)Take care of my sheep, 3) Feed my sheep..."

The Book of Order says, "The ministry of deacon as set forth in Scripture is one of compassion, witness, and service, sharing in the redeeming love of Jesus Christ for the poor, the hungry, the sick, he lost, the friendless, the oppressed, those burdened by unjust policies or structures or anyone in distress."

First Presbyterian Church's Standard Operating Procedure says, "The Deacons are the foundation of FPC's efforts to provide care and support for members and friends of the church."

The Deacon's Standard Operating Procedure says, "Shepherding: Keep in contact with the persons on your list, especially if a health issue or family emergency is noted and/or if the member is absent for several weeks. When there are concerns please bring them to the Deacons attention."

I don't know how long Shepherding at FPC has been going on but when we joined in 1991 we were contacted by our 'Shepherd'. The name changed then changed back but the premise was the same-that each member had a member to check on them.

So the Question remains, "Who is your FPC shepherd?" Did you know you had one? Eight people have answered the call to be Shepherds. They are or have been Deacons or Elders, they are 'people oriented' and have your welfare in mind. They may email you, send cards or notes, call, or just see you in church and ask how you are doing. You may not want the phone calls or special attention and that is OK. But we are hoping that if you have need of a visit, a ride, prayers and or joys to share that you will contact your Shepherd. The list is posted on the Bulletin Board in the Narthex. The list is reviewed every few months. If you don't see your name, please let Arlene or any of the Deacons or Shepherds know.
