SHEPHERDS

On the Deacons agenda every month is the item 'Shepherds'. I asked the question last month, "Who is your Shepherd" to which Pastor Tim promptly replied, "The Lord is my Shepherd". Wouldn't it be wonderful if we all answered so quickly? But that was not the answer I was seeking..."Who is your Church Shepard?", Did you know you even had one? I checked the Bible Concordance when I got home and there were 31 references to the word *Shepherd or Shepherding* in the Bible. And even more if you reference the word *sheep.* The favorite and one we all know is Psalm 23 "The Lord is my Shepherd...." My favorite from the New Testament is from John, Chapter 21 where Jesus asks Simon Peter three times "Do you love me?" And when Simon Peter answers "Yes, Lord you know that I love you" to all the questions, Jesus says, "1)Feed my lambs, 2)Take care of my sheep, 3) Feed my sheep..."

The Book of Order says, "The ministry of deacon as set forth in Scripture is one of compassion, witness, and service, sharing in the redeeming love of Jesus Christ for the poor, the hungry, the sick, he lost, the friendless, the oppressed, those burdened by unjust policies or structures or anyone in distress."

First Presbyterian Church's Standard Operating Procedure says, "The Deacons are the foundation of FPC's efforts to provide care and support for members and friends of the church."

The Deacon's Standard Operating Procedure says, "Shepherding: Keep in contact with the persons on your list, especially if a health issue or family emergency is noted and/or if the member is absent for several weeks. When there are concerns please bring them to the Deacons attention." I don't know how long Shepherding at FPC has been going on but when we joined in 1991 we were contacted by our 'Shepherd'. The name changed then changed back but the premise was the same-that each member had a member to check on them.

So the Question remains, "Who is your FPC shepherd?" Did you know you had one? Eight people have answered the call to be Shepherds. They are or have been Deacons or Elders, they are 'people oriented' and have your welfare in mind. They may email you, send cards or notes, call, or just see you in church and ask how you are doing. You may not want the phone calls or special attention and that is OK. But we are hoping that if you have need of a visit, a ride, prayers and or joys to share that you will contact your Shepherd. The list is posted on the Bulletin Board in the Narthex. The list is reviewed every few months. If you don't see your name, please let Arlene or any of the Deacons or Shepherds know.

PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH TO HOST SUMMER SAFARI SPECTACULAR

An intergenerational Vacation Bible School focusing on the subjects of poverty and homelessness, immigration and emergency relief will be taking place at Leavenworth First Presbyterian Church, 407 Walnut, July 16-18.

Open to the public, the Summer Safari Spectacular will consist of three nights of Study, Activities, Fellowship, Action, Reflection and Inspiration, SAFARI, based upon the Bible's "love chapter," I Corinthians 13.

During what is being called One Hour of Great Sharing, adults will hear presentations by Sister Vicki Perkins, director of Leavenworth Community of Hope, Jermaine Wilson, mayor of Leavenworth, the Rev. Rick Behrens, pastor of Grandview Park Presbyterian Church in Kansas City, Kan., Advocates for

Immigrant Rights & Reconciliation, and Jesse Miguel, a ruling elder at Southminster Presbyterian Church in Prairie Village. Meanwhile, children and youth will be learning more about these same subjects through mini-lessons and hands-on projects designed with them in mind.

Both Perkins and Wilson will be speaking July 16. The two of them have extensive experience working with the poor and homeless in and around Leavenworth. Behrens and representatives of AIRR (Advocates for Immigrants Rights and Reconciliation) will have the floor July 17. Berhands' Grandview Park church has a long history of working with immigrants in the greater Kansas City area. Miguel will be talking about the Presbyterian Disaster Assistance program July 18. Having been to many places where disaster has struck, he will be able to provide a first-hand account of how this program has made a difference in the lives of people around the world.

"I am very excited about this three-evening event and invite children, youth and adults from the community to come and join us as we explore ways we can put our faith into action in very timely and practical ways," the Rev. Tim Soule, church pastor, said. "Come one night, two nights or all three! We would love to have you join us."

The nightly schedule calls for dinner to be served at 5:30 p.m., with One Hour of Great Sharing to start at 6:45. Dessert is to be served at 8 in conjunction with the closing exercise.

There will be no charge for a meal, but freewill donations will be accepted. Reservations are requested to help with the planning of meals. To make a reservation, call the church office at 913-682-6891 or visit the church's Facebook page.
