NEW GENERATION SINGERS COMING TO FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH!

The New Generation singers, known as New G, are a highly energetic group of high school and college students from St. Joseph. They love Jesus and they come from many different churches in St. Joseph. They're hard to define, in all the best of ways.

If we had to describe the New Generation singers in a song, what would it be? This is a serious challenge. The song would have to include 48 years. 48 states. Six Canadian provinces. Hundreds of alumni. Thousands of frozen pizzas sold. And thousands upon thousands of hours spent rehearsing, planning, writing, encouraging, listening and laughing across multiple faith denominations. Lots of laughing.

In fact, the singing is just the beginning. The students, ages eighth grade to early college, take on leadership positions and work on committees within the group, across the year, as they create and carry out their pinnacle two-week summer tour. Membership to New G is open to anyone within the age parameters, regardless of experience with singing.

"Many of our members do really enjoy singing, but some join us for the social aspects or to build their leadership skills. Others enjoy the planning, the writing of the shows, the production and the travel," says Byron Myers II, music director/leader/professional volunteer/alumni for New G since 1998. "And some students come to us out of sheer curiosity and end up staying. We enjoy all the kids, across all faiths, and it's always been a very open door." There's a legitimate sense of roots and of belonging in these words. Myers and his wife, Carol, are the second generation to lead the group. It was started by his parents, Byron and Phyllis Myers, in 1970. "At that time, a lot of Christian music groups were hitting the road and changing their format of their music. We were definitely one of many groups around. But we stayed and have continued to grow," he explains. Today, the group performs locally throughout the year and at several national (and international) locations along an annual two-week summer tour.

MISSION COMMITTEE NEWS

LITTLE PANTRY

The Mission Committee met last Sunday and discussed needs of the Little Pantry at length. It is apparent that the pantry has become a much-used source of nutrition in the time of rising food costs. It was reported that the Federal Food Distribution at the Mission on Spruce has been reduced to two times a month with less items available. The Little Pantry has no list of approved persons or restrictions on income. The food is given in the spirit of Matthew 25, giving to the needy as an act of Christian love. The pantry was originally set up for the homeless living in the area of the church and the many bridges over the creek. Now we are asking you to expand that gift to the needy living in the area. Often the persons in need are the working poor who cannot afford transportation to work, monthly bills and adequate food. We are asking the congregation to continue your support of the Little Pantry but to add to your list of items needed all kitchen basics that are stable in the current weather.

A few suggestions - The original list suggested single serving items not needing a can opener. Items needing a can opener are fine now, can openers have been given out by the Community of Hope some time ago. Water is always needed. There is a need for proteins - tuna, peanut butter, canned meats. Items in glass containers are a problem. Regular sized canned fruit and vegetables and Romain noodles were suggested also. Every item put in the pantry has used by someone, even the 7 packages of wheat tortillas once left.

The Pantry is filled three times a week by volunteers. The Methodist church adds to it, but not on a regular schedule. If you notice it empty feel free to add to the store at any time. Bring your donations to the church on Sunday and leave them in the tub in the entry.

The committee thanks you for all your donations in the past and in the future.


