SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

- The Carol Ann Low Scholarship is for members of the congregation who are 2018 graduating seniors and will be entering college in 2018-2019.





Dear Friends,

I do not know how many of you know that I am getting prepared for a trip to Kenya. The group I am traveling with will be leaving from KCI on Memorial Day and returning June 8th. This delegation from Heartland Presbytery will be working in a tiny village, Thwake, from which one of our presbytery's current pastors, Rev David Nzioka, hails. Rev. Nzioka will be leading our trip. We will stay on his family's homestead in the village and worship and work with his home church.

Previous groups from Heartland have helped build a medical clinic, a small girls' school and a church. We will be working on the very beginning of a community building. The medical clinic will be open with a dentist, surgeon, and several nurses in our party. We will work alongside the local nurses and staff to assist community members with health care, spiritual needs and concerns.

This is a first venture for me across the Atlantic and into Africa. I am excited and a bit nervous. The trip to the village will take nearly 24 hours one way. Those who have gone before me have told me it is worth every minute and much more. I looked up the village yesterday on Google Earth. From the air it looked like a small farming operation in the southwestern corner of Kansas. However, not far away was a small wooded area and a fairly large river. There were no power lines, no paved roads, just vast open expanse of land. I have the feeling I will learn about natural darkness as the only power is solar. Thwake Village is a four to five hour drive east of Nairobi.

At the end of our stay we will visit a National Park and have opportunity to see and photograph African wildlife. The trip will be a challenge in many ways. The challenge I am most interested in at this point is in making friends with brothers and sisters in the faith and seeing how I can interact and communicate in this setting. My prayer is that God will work in me as is needed for the moments I am there. May I be ready to learn, to remain open to new experiences and people, and share myself fully with the people I meet.

On June 10th I may be tired and jetlagged but I will return ready to begin to share my adventure with you. Meanwhile, we have Lent, Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter to commemorate and celebrate. I am always energized for this important journey of faith and new life. Plan to be with us for all our services between now and Easter Sunday. Blessings,
