Dear Friends,

The Transition Team of FPCLVKS is getting ready to wrap up their work in anticipation of the election of the Pastor Nominating Committee. Since late March the Transition team has hosted three different opportunities for group discussion, they have had many one on one conversations, they have designed a survey and as of this writing, the survey will close on September 12. They will receive the results of the survey and then write a report for the session and the congregation outlying the results and Pastor Nominating Committee will take those results and include them in the Mission Information Form (kind of a Church's resume) that will go out to pastors who are looking for new calls. In the midst of all of that, the Holy Spirit will keep on working as we move forward.

FPCLVKS is in a wonderful mission field. You are surrounded by a community of people needing to know the love of Jesus Christ. And needing to know that concretely. We have just wrapped up the first segment of the Gospels Reading Project. We spend the entire month of August reading the gospel of Matthew, gathering in small groups to share what we have gleaned and listen to what others have gleaned, and we have heard reflections of our readings on Sunday mornings in worship. It dawned on me that a major theme near the beginning and end of the gospel of Matthew is that Jesus is calling us to behave in a loving matter. The entire sermon on the mount is about ethical behavior. The end of chapter 25 – "When you did to the least of these, you did it to me" – is also a call to treat people with love and respect – particularly the "least of these". I think you will find incredibly rich possibilities in new ministries with a new pastor as you live into these ways of being. So, I am excited for your direction.

But you have to be realistic about who you are, where you are, and where you are going. You are not FPCLVKS of 10 or 20 years ago. Your honest, active membership is around 80. You will not be able to do everything. But God won't be expecting you to do everything. God will ask you to take some risks. God will ask you to not live your faith in fear. God will ask you to open your hearts to new possibilities. The very end of Matthew has Jesus speaking these words — "And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age." These are words both for each and every one of you and for the church as a community. I am excited to see what God will reveal to us in these next few months.

Hamburger helper or similar meal


Top it off with your favorite box dessert
